Dóibh siúd nach raibh aithne agaibh air, bhunaigh Jim an scoil 25 bliain ó shin. Is mar gheall ar a fhís, a fhuinneamh agus a fhlaithiúlacht ama a bhí Jim ábalta dúshraith chomh daingean sin a thabhairt don scoil, rud a lig dúinn fás ina scoil bheo bhríomhar atá inti anois. We would like to pass on our deepest sympathies to the O'Donnell family on the passing of Jim, just before Christmas.

For those of you who didn't know him, Jim was the founder of Gaelscoil Uí Néill, 25 years ago this year. It was Jim's vision, energy and dedication that gave the school its solid foundation that has allowed us to grow and become what we are today. He opened the first Irish-medium school in Tyrone in 1995, with only four pupils, and he continued to support and advise on the Board of Governors until recently. From acorns do mighty oaks grow, with almost 300 pupils having passed through the gates of Gaelscoil Uí Néill over the years. With 175 pupils currently enrolled in the school, hundreds more attending Scoil Iósaef, Gaelscoil Aodha Rua and Gaelscoil Eoghain, each of these schools in turn inspired by the success of Gaelscoil Uí Néill, Jim's legacy will be the gift of the Irish language given to the many, many children who have passed, and who will pass through the Irish-medium sector in mid-Ulster in years to come.


The Breaksit Debate

Ag tús an téarma, d'athraigh muid ar ais go sos maidine amháin le chéile ach tharla gur mhothaigh na páistí go raibh barraíocht ann. The children returned to school in September and quickly started complaining, not about homework, but about the crowded yard. We had reverted to one, shared break but there proved to be too many children in the yard. The School Council took matters into their hands and organized a referendum, a Breaksit Referendum. Question Time was held, the votes were cast and there was a decisive outcome: 103 votes for a split break and 47 for a shared break. We reverted to a split break and the children reverted to complaining about homework!




A Day in the Life of Rang 1

Paperback Writers


