

How do day, night and the four seasons occur?


There are eight planets in our solar system.

The Earth is the third planet from the sun.

We call the Earth 'The Blue Planet' because of its colour. When the sun is directed toward one side of the Earth, daytime occurs on that side of the Earth and on the side that does not receive rays from the sun, it is night time. The Earth rotates on its axis around the sun.

The seasons occur because the Earth rotates around the sun. The Earth is inclined on its axis and when the Earth is inclined towards the sun, the weather is warmer. When we are inclined away from the sun, the weather is colder.

The Earth is divided into two hemispheres: the northern hemisphere and the southern hemisphere. When it is summer in the northern hemisphere, it is winter time in the southern hemisphere.

Did you know that it is 238,900 miles from the Earth to the moon? That interesting fact was brought to us by Mary from the library who, once again, called into school to inform the children about this summer's Library Reading Challenge. Across the North of Ireland, the challenge has been set to read 238,900 books over the summer. Our pupils always rise to the summer reading challenge and we hope that as many children as possible reach for the stars and add quite a few miles to the long reading journey ahead.
